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Scott introduced two of the newly hired Sanitarians, Mary Jensen & Katelynn Jones. Scott stated that he is still seeking a qualified applicant for the CHSC Program Manager. He explained that Sara Flack continues to contract with the SCHD on a limited, part-time basis to keep the program moving forward until her replacement can be found. SCHD staff participated in a Suicide Prevention Awareness Training during October. Mary Jump reported that there were approximately 109 households that participated in the Household Hazardous Waste event. Participants were asked to complete a satisfaction survey. Among those that responded (26), most were satisfied or very satisfied with the event. Scott provided the BOH with copies of the PHEP 1st Qtr. Annual Review Report. Scott also reported that Cathy Bond has notified him that she is planning to retire from her Public Health Emergency Preparedness consultation work after her 2025-2026 contract expires. Scott made the BOH aware of the new E.I. Hub database that has been rolled out by the NYSDOH. He reported that the new database has been plagued with numerous issues. 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Closed	Scott	Information	was determined that the child died from respiratory arrest from epiglottitis secondary to haemophilus influenza infection. Scott gave credit to the SCHD nursing staff on their handling of the situation.  Scott reported that he had received a message from a county employee who had stated that through the Narcan trainings that we offer, she was able to administer Narcan to a family member in need and saved their life. Dale Freier, MD, stated that he has not needed to resuscitate anyone in the Emergency Department in the past 10 months and he credits the increased availability of Naloxone to the public as the reason for this.  Scott asked that the BOH members inform us if they want to meet in December or wait and convene in January since the December meeting is only a week from the holidays.
